

MANUSCRIPT PREPARATION RULES

The text should be 12 point Times New Roman, 1.5 line space and justified. The text should be 3 cm margins at head and foot, 3 cm margin for left, 2.5 cm margin for right. There should not be any margins while starting a paragraph or writing sub-titles. There should not be any space before and after paragraphs.

The participants of Symposium of Philosophy, Education and Science History should consider APA 6 rules, especially regarding in-text citation and reference list, while writing their abstracts and full texts. Basic reference styles should be like:

If page number is given citing in-text, (Kuhn, 2008, 72) or (Kuhn, 2008, 72-85) format should be used. If secondary sources are used, citing in-text should be like (Kuhn, 1970 as cited in Overton, 2012). If more than one source is cited than alphabetical order should be followed (Aydın, 2012; English, 2002; Greenfield, 1986).

Related to the reference list, APA 6 should be examined. To guide, some examples are given below:
